



## Projects

**Dykes Road Drainage:** South Broward Drainage District redesigned the plans for re-bid. Bids are due March 19<sup>th</sup>.

**DEP Funded Drainage Projects:** South Broward Drainage District has agreed to design the Dykes Road project (#1 below), which will save the Town thousands of dollars. A proposal from Keith and Associates to survey and design the other projects was approved by the Town Council on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. The specific consortium of drainage projects includes the following:

- Construct catch basin adjacent to 5501 SW 136th Avenue (Holatee Trail) with associated piping and headwall structure connecting to the Central Broward Water Control District (CBWCD) S-33 Canal on the east side of Holatee Trail.
- Upgrade culverts and restoration of eastside swale along Dykes Road from Huntridge Drive to Calusa Corners Park with new underdrain and headwall connections at SW 51<sup>st</sup> Manor, SW 53<sup>rd</sup> Court, SW 54<sup>th</sup> Place and SW 56<sup>th</sup> Street. New outfalls will connect to the South Broward Drainage District (SBDD) No. 10 Canal.
- Install catch basins and associated piping at the intersection of SW 54th Place and SW 188th Avenue, connecting westward to the South Broward Drainage District (SBDD) No. 12 Canal.
- Grade swales and install drainage pipe to connect an existing catch basin on SW 178<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW 46<sup>th</sup> Street to the South Broward Drainage District (SBDD) Rolling Oaks Lateral Canal.
- Install catch basins and associated piping at the SW 201<sup>st</sup> Avenue cul-de-sac, connecting to the South Broward Drainage District (SBDD) Canal.

**Stirling Road Guardrail:** The Town awarded the contract to Weekley Asphalt Paving Inc. during the January Town Council meeting. The notice to proceed was issued, and

construction will begin March 5<sup>th</sup>. The project will be substantially completed within 45 days.

**Transportation Surface and Drainage Ongoing Rehabilitation Program (TSDOR):**

Construction is estimated to begin February 2018. Staff has coordinated with property owners along SW 130<sup>th</sup> Avenue who are dedicating right-of-way.

Surveying and design purchase orders for the FY 2019 construction project are on the March 8<sup>th</sup> Town Council agenda for approval.

**Entranceway Signs:** Staff has submitted permit applications to Broward County and South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) for two new entranceway signs along Griffin Road: one near Dykes Road and the other near Bonaventure Boulevard. SFWMD will not permit the entranceway sign along the canal bank near Dykes Road. Staff attended the December Rural Public Arts Advisory Board meeting to discuss potential other locations. The Revocable License Agreements were approved during the September 13<sup>th</sup> Town Council meeting. Broward County is processing the ILA and will place it on a future County Commission meeting (TBD) agenda for approval.

**Roadway Striping:** Council approved the Fiscal Year 2018 striping project (Mather Boulevard) during the January Town Council meeting.

**Fire Modular Replacement:** The site plan is being drafted for permitting. Construction is estimated to be 45 days. The departments will be temporarily relocated to the Country Estates Park during construction.

**Frontier Trails Park Improvements:** An updated wetlands determination letter has been requested to Broward County so the Town can begin design of the parking improvements.

**Town Hall Lightning Protection:** Staff has received three (3) quotes for the work and a purchase order has been issued.

**Traffic Delineators extension on Dykes Road south of Griffin Road:** Staff has coordinated with Weekley Asphalt Paving the extension of traffic delineators on Dykes Road to prevent illegal U-turns.

**Griffin Road Turn Lanes:** Staff met with Broward County, and requested turn lanes on Griffin Road at SW 190<sup>th</sup> Avenue and SW 198<sup>th</sup> Terrace. Richard Tornese committed to installing the turn lane at SW 190<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Construction should commence in 2019.

**Drainage Issue on SW 178<sup>th</sup> Avenue near Griffin Road:** Staff met with Broward County, and they agreed to potentially sever the drainage connection or install a weir to stop the bubble up that is occurring on SW 178<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
