

COVID-19 (Coronavirus) UPDATE

March 24,2020

The Town is continuing to monitor developments related to the COVID-19 response. Here is the latest:

- Governor DeSantis has issued Executive Order 20-70 and 20-71 which orders all non-essential businesses to be closed.
- Broward County issued Executive Orders 20-01 and 20-02 which further specified which businesses are essential and can remain open.
- Town Hall remains closed to the public, but most Town services are maintained.
- Town parks will remain open for passive use, but restroom facilities and playgrounds have been closed.
- Mobile COVID-19 testing is currently being done at CB Smith Park in Pembroke Pines, Cleveland Clinic in Weston, and Broward Health in Pompano Beach. This testing is only available to those meeting the following criteria:
 - First responders with symptoms
 - Those over 65 with symptoms and chronic conditions
 - Recent international travelers with symptoms
 - Pre-screening and registration is required. Call each location for details at 954-276-4680 for CB Smith Park location, 954-659-5951 for Cleveland Clinic location, and 954-320-5730 for Broward Health.
