



Broward JIC Snapshot #30: Local Sites Offer Incentives for Vaccines

More than 10.1 million Floridians have now been vaccinated for COVID-19, and 984,509 Broward residents have been vaccinated with at least one dose. (Broward statistic corrected June 1, 2021) DOH-Broward continues to partner with Broward County, municipalities, BSO, Broward County Public Schools and other partners to make COVID-19 vaccine available to all Broward County residents. Additionally, private providers and retail pharmacies are integral to COVID-19 vaccine access.

LOCAL VACCINATION AND TEST COLLECTION SITE UPDATES

- The “pop-up” sites operated by Florida Department of Health in Broward (DOH-Broward) in partnership with Broward County, municipalities, faith based institutions, businesses and institutes of higher education are striving to reach younger age groups and those who are vaccine-hesitant. - Memorial Day weekend pop-ups offer a \$10 grocery gift certificate as an incentive to **Take the Shot!** The gift certificates will be given to all individuals receiving their first dose of COVID-19 vaccine and are accepted at local supermarkets. Upcoming events include:
 - Miramar Family Night at Miramar Regional Park – 6-10:30PM on Friday, May 28
 - Hollywood Broadwalk Charnow Park – 10AM-6PM – Friday through Sunday, May 28-30
 - North Lauderdale Teen Center – 8AM – 1PM on Saturday, May 29
 - Mass Arts District in Fort Lauderdale – 6-11PM on Saturday, May 29
- Other vaccine providers, such as CVS are offering contests and incentives to boost vaccination rates. [Read Sun Sentinel Article](#)
- The vaccination site at Nova Southeastern University is now operated by Florida Department of Health in Broward (DOH-Broward). The indoor, walk-up site in Davie offers Pfizer vaccine to ages 12+, and is open noon to 8PM Monday through Wednesday and 10AM – 6PM on Saturday and Sunday. [View all Fixed Vaccine Site Locations](#)
- The Broward College North Campus vaccination site in Coconut Creek and the Vizcaya Park vaccination site in Miramar, both operated by the Florida Division of Emergency Management (FDEM), are now offering second shots only of the Pfizer vaccine and single dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine. Both of these sites will close permanently on Friday, June 18.
- All test collection and vaccination sites operated by DOH-Broward will be closed on Monday, May 31 in observance of Memorial Day. Broward County’s COVID-19 hotline is also closed on Memorial Day. However the vaccination sites operated by FDEM (Broward College and Vizcaya Park) will be open.

MARINERS TAKE THE SHOT IN UNIQUE VACCINE PARTNERSHIP

Mariners aboard cruise and cargo ships docking at Broward County’s Port Everglades are receiving COVID-19 vaccinations through a partnership between FDEM, Port Everglades, the Seafarer’s House, Celebrity Cruises, Holland America Line, Princess Cruises and Royal Caribbean International. The program has vaccinated more than 1,570 mariners aboard some 25 cruise and cargo ships, and is also open to port workers and those who conduct business at Port Everglades until it closes permanently on Sunday, June 20.
